Gardening Safety at the Waterfront

As the gardening season begins we need to remind you of safe gardening at the waterfront.

A copy of these guidelines is available from our website as well. Please take a few minutes to re-acquaint yourself with the guidelines before you head out to the waterfront. Each year we remind you that there is a weight limit of 25 pounds per bag for garden debris. Please ensure that you stay under this limit to prevent injury to yourself and staff at the waterfront who have to lift the bags from the ground to their truck for disposal.

Please consider wearing glasses or safety glasses when pruning shrubs and always be careful moving in your garden if you are near shrubs!

Springboard: Intermittent Community Work Program

Looking for Interested Team Leaders

A message from ICWP, "Any Team Leaders need an extra hand on weekends? ICWP can help!

Springboard delivers the Intermittent Community Work Program (ICWP) in partnership with the Ministry of Community Safety & Correctional Services. This restorative justice program provides adult men who meet strict eligibility criteria the opportunity to perform community work as an alternative to spending weekends in jail. Last year, 884 men across the province were able to take responsibility for their actions and give back a total of 58, 951 volunteer hours to the community.

The organizations providing the volunteer opportunities to ICWP participants include thrift stores, community centres, service clubs, faith communities, food banks, and more. ICWP volunteers must be supervised by a Team Leader or assigned volunteer who Springboard can reach by phone to confirm attendance, and their shifts must be determined ahead of the weekend. A minimal amount of paperwork is required prior to beginning, so if you are interested, please contact Springboard with at least a week's notice.

Heritage Gardeners Bee Homes

There are many benefits to having bee homes in gardens for both the bees and as well as the garden itself. Bees provide the plants with pollen, which in turn creates a more desirable flower or plant. Along with giving the bees a sustainable place to thrive healthily. There are a few of these bee homes around the waterfront gardens, some of which we would want to eventually relocate from one bed to another.

The moving process for a small bee home requires some patience and planning ahead. The move for bees may be stressful and if not done carefully, some bees may be left behind or become lost. Some things to think about before relocating a hive are the preparation before the move, the day of, and a few days after the move. Before moving a bee home, you will have to take into consideration the length of the move (whether it will be just a few feet away, or a few miles), the time of day (early morning before dusk, or late at night. This is so that none of the bees are left behind and makes for a less stressful move for the bees). As well as the weather. Paying close attention to the weather on the day of, as well as a few days after the move. Relocating a bee home during a rainy cold day, or in the winter is preferred. However, if you are going to move them in the warmer months – its best to choose a cooler/rainy day over a hot day.

During the move, it is important to keep in mind the health of the bees as well.

Making sure that the container they are in is well ventilated as well as secure (using #8 hardware cloth with #2 staples to cover any open spaces). Making sure that the bees do not escape. Once the homes are secured and covered, it is best to start the move as soon as these steps are done.



Once relocated to the preferred site, reorientation may be needed for shorter moves (less than 2 miles). Some tips for achieving the best results would be introducing sequestration – this requires leaving the entrance screen for up to 72 hours after the move. This will cause some of the bees to restore themselves before going out. However, this does stress the bees and isn't recommended on hot days. As well as placing an

object in front of the entrance of the hive. A leafy branch or a similar object will cause the bees to re-establish themselves because the view is unknown.

Moving bee homes may seen like a daunting task, but with the right amount of patience, planning and preparation before a move will make the whole process a lot less taxing.

Open Executive Committee Positions 2017

1. Executive Committee Recording Secretary

The Executive Committee Recording Secretary is a volunteer position that reports to the Executive Committee Co-Chairs. The purpose of the Recording Secretary is to record the meeting minutes and maintain the records of the Executive meetings. Responsibilities of this role include recording and distributing meeting minutes.

2. Executive Committee Advisor (2 Positions)

The Executive Committee Advisor position is a volunteer position that reports to the Executive Committee Co-chairs. The purpose of the position is to offer advice to the Co-Chairs and the Executive on policies, procedures, and organizational performances for the successful functioning of the organization. Responsibilities include providing guidance to the Executive members and reviewing procedures.

Commitment

The time commitment for each position is approximately two hours each month to attend Executive Committee meetings and other activities. *Meeting times are flexible!*

CANADA PLACE 150: ART PIECE

Canada Place 150 Art Project to celebrate diversity and inclusion



What does diversity and inclusion mean to you? The North Bay Heritage Gardeners are inviting the public to share their vision by participating in a unique community art project on September 22, 2017 at the W.K.P. Kennedy Gallery.

The Seeds of Diversity and Inclusion Canvas is part of the Heritage Gardener's Canada Place 150 project, a new gathering place and gardens to be built on the waterfront this fall with funding from the Department of Canadian Heritage.

Community members are invited to the W.K.P. Kennedy Gallery, during the Sept 22, 2017 Gallery Hop, to paint and draw their vision of diversity on a canvas circle that will be sewn into a larger canvas that will be unveiled at the Gallery on November 1, 2017. Local photographers are invited to submit pictures that exemplify diversity and inclusion to the Heritage Gardeners.

This projects is in celebration of Canada's 150th anniversary and the North Bay Heritage Gardeners 20th anniversary, as a project to "plant seeds of diversity and inclusion." Canada Place 150 will act as a gateway to North Bay's waterfront and the 50+ award winning garden beds. The gathering place will be located across from the pedestrian underpass that connects the waterfront with downtown.

"Through this community art project, we are inviting our neighbours to reflect on diversity, and how this idea informs their own experience of Canada. We hope that this project will culminate in an artwork which represents the diverse fabric of perspectives

which make up the place which we call home - North Bay, Canada," said Hariett Madigan, Heritage Gardeners Co-chair.

Children from Lyndsay Weld Centre and new Canadians from the North Bay & District Multi-cultural Centre are involved in the Canada Place 150 Project. In addition to contributing to the Canvas, they will participate in the planting of the new gardens and opening ceremony celebrations for Canada Place 150.

"Opportunities to engage with people, places, and the natural world in the local environment help children, families, educators, and communities build connections, learn and discover, and make contributions to the world around them. It fosters a sense of belonging to the local community, the natural environment, and the larger universe of living things. As well, communities benefit from the rich experiences they have in learning about, with, and from children," said Teresa Evers, Program Coordinator at Lindsay Weld Centre for Children.

News and updates about upcoming events and activities will be posted to the Heritage Gardeners website and social media pages.

"Diversity is what makes us thrive; Just ask a natural ecosystem and it will tell you that biodiversity is vital to its success. When we respect diversity, and celebrate the unique qualities which make up the whole, we live in harmony. CANADA PLACE 150: PIÈCE D'ART

Projet artistique « Canada Place 150 » - pour célébrer la diversité et l'inclusion



Qu'est-ce que la diversité et l'inclusion vous signifient? Les jardiniers "Heritage" de North Bay vous invitent à partager votre vision en participant à un projet d'art communautaire unique le 22 septembre 2017 à la Galérie W.K.P. Kennedy.

Une muraille gigantesque nous fera réfléchir aux idées de diversité et d'inclusion. « Canada Place 150 », un nouveau lieu de rassemblement et des nouveaux jardins seront construits sur le front de lac cet automne avec des fonds du ministère du Patrimoine Canadien.


